Habitat Clallam believes that together we can build strength, stability, and self-reliance through shelter




Why?

The Habitat Clallam Repair team went out for an initial visit to determine the extent of work needed. John, our Repair Team Lead, discovered that Rosie's house would require more than just paint. The siding and fascia boards would need to be replaced and new gutters installed to ensure additional internal and external damage wouldn't occur.

Everything about Rosie is colorful; her beautiful garden, her bright yellow car, and her delightful personality. So it was no surprise when Rosie presented us with her chosen paint palette. Five colors and handful of Habitat repairs later, Rosie's home is back to being the gem of the neighborhood.
